East Walnut Hills Assembly Meeting

Curious about the Two-Way Street Conversion Project in East Walnut Hills? Construction of this transformative Project is set to begin soon. To find out more and to weigh in on the final piece of funding needed for the Project, you are invited to attend the City of Cincinnati's Community Engagement virtual meeting on April 25, 2022, at 4:00 p.m. Notice of the meeting, including, information on how to attend virtually is included below.

As a result of nearly five years of East Walnut Hills community's collaborative engagement with the City, the City is beginning construction of the EWH Two-Way Street Conversion Project. The Project design is the same as the final design approved by the East Walnut Hills Assembly's Stakeholder Committee in 2020. The Project, when completed, will transform the block of William Howard Taft Road, Woodburn Avenue and McMillan Avenue. The streets will be converted from one-way to two-way to improve pedestrian safety, calm vehicular traffic and knit the East Walnut Hills business district back together. A new streetscape (new paver sidewalks, new lights) will be installed along south Woodburn Avenue, continuing the design that's in place on the rest of Woodburn in the business district. On the north side of William Howard Taft Road, a new sidewalk and trees will be installed.

The meeting on will focus on funding a gap in the financing for the Project. Two million dollars of East Walnut Hills (EWH) Tax Increment Financing Dollars (TIF)) funding was allocated to the Project in the fall of 2020. The first step in this process is the Community Engagement Meeting on April 25.
